Jay Morgan Bopp, Juror

Jay is currently the Chair of the Division of Art and Design for Bob Jones University in Greenville, SC, a position he has held since 2007. He holds a Masters of Fine Arts from Savannah College of Art and Design, A Master of Arts from Bob Jones University and a Bachelor of Arts from Bob Jones Univ.

Jay Bopp is a designer, painter and art educator. His paintings may be found in several corporate collections including AT&T, Bank of America, CRS Serrine and many private collections. He has had more than 28 one-man or group exhibitions and served many years as director of the Bob Jones University Art Agency. Jay has won many awards in competition and festivals throughout the Southeast. His design clients have included General Electric, Covenant College, Perception Kayaks and the Georgia Boy Choir. In conjunction with the lead juror responsibilities, Jay also conducted a two-day workshop focusing on exploration of the gestural landscape in oils. Jay encouraged participants to establish a free and expressive interpretation on the canvas and to work within a restricted color system to suggest space as indicated by the source images. Advanced participants were able to introduce non-landscape elements such as symbols and type (letterforms) to deepen the communicative potential of the painting. On the second day, he discussed self promotion offering ideas and steps for gaining exposure and getting work into galleries and other venues.

Juror's Comments

I was delighted with the variety and quality of the artwork submitted for the show. In particular, I enjoyed the strong individuality and range of approaches in evidence. I was very impressed with some of the specialized techniques exhibited in addition to the more traditional techniques. From the nuance of watercolor to the power of oil to the delicacy of graphite, this exhibition has manifold opportunities to please the viewer.

The selection of Best in Show and place winners was particularly challenging. There was much to recommend each piece. In the end, it came to discerning details and critically comparing specific elements. I am very grateful to have had the opportunity to be a part of this fine exhibition.
