OUR JUROR

Sterling Edwards was born in Kansas City, Missouri in 1951. As a child, he showed a natural ability to draw and was enrolled in art classes at the age of 12, working in every medium. In 1985, he began studying transparent watercolors and was immediately captivated by the freshness and luminosity of the medium. Using large brushes, Sterling focuses on the design of the subject using stylized shapes, bold lights and darks and dramatic color rhythms.

In 1993, Sterling began teaching his style of painting to watercolor artists of all skill levels. His reputation grew and he was in demand across the United States and Canada. He has been featured in artist's magazines and numerous newspapers. Sterling is one of the founding artists of "Art Academy Live", a web-based international art instruction company. In 2007, he was elected as a Signature member of the Canadian Society of Painters in Watercolor. Sterling's paintings are in private and corporate collections worldwide. He lives and works from his studio in Hendersonville, North Carolina.

Juror's Statement

I look for strong composition and play of light against dark. Typically, I discourage the use of colored mats in competitions. Technical proficiency is always a strong consideration. Each piece of art should, when possible, be an interpretation by the artist. Often the simple forms combined with strong values have an artistic attraction.

I congratulate all of those who took the time and had the commitment to their art to enter this competition. It is never easy to jury a show. I am honored to have been invited and I respect each and every one of you.
