This is the Town's signature event which brings thousands of residents and visitors to the lakeside community for a day of family fun and festivities. The parade begins at 9:30 am, starting from the GIS parking lot on Chapin Road and goes straight through town to the Bi-Lo shopping center. Immediately following the parade, there will be live entertainment on the Mid-Carolina Electric Cooperative Stage featuring the popular R&B band Cash Money. In addition, there is the Publix Children's Area featuring activities and games on Clark Street, a Classic Car Show hosted by the Newberry Car Buffs and Taylor's Automotive in the Mt. Horeb parking lot off Beaufort Street, and street vendors selling a variety of arts and crafts, clothing items, food and knick knacks. The Chapin Branch Library (where we have also a featured artist each month) will be holding its annual book sale in the Community Room at Chapin Town Hall (157 NW Columbia Avenue) until 2:30 pm, with proceeds benefiting children and youth reading programs. A number of our members will be participating in the Festival and Parade.
