Juror's Statement

I am honored to serve as your juror this year. As an artist I understand how each of you has poured your heart and soul into your paintings. We all want our viewers to feel a connection with our work. We want them to feel and see what we felt and saw. That connection is important to us. And so winning an award feels like we have accomplished that connection and not receiving an award feels like somehow we failed. Let me say right now, no one in this show has failed or is a failure. We are all at different levels in our painting. I would like to encourage each and everyone of you to never to give up or slow down but to continue to paint daily.

In selecting the paintings for awards there are several things that I look for. The very first thing is a connection to the painting, that is personal, and why different jurors pick different paintings. It is why you might win award in one show and get rejected in another show with the same picture. I then begin to look at elements and principles of design within the paintings. Last I look at the content, the visual message and the technique. The award winners have pushed their paintings to another level, whether it be design, color, value, content or technique. They have not stopped at a safe place but have gone further.

Thank you for allowing me this opportunity to connect with each of you. It has been a pleasure.
