Juror Comments

Todd Baxter – Lead Juror

I was very impressed with the quality of work both professional and amateur. It was obvious to me that the artists loved what they were doing.

Associate Jurors, Alexandra Stasko from USC and Del'Te Robinson from Benedict College were a huge help in making tough decisions. We started the process with a quick walk through tagging works that caught our attention and then spent time reviewing the works and discussing the merits of each piece before coming to a final decision. One quality that was present in all selected works was technical excellence.

Alexandra Stasko – USC Associate Juror

Alexandra Stasko is an artist based in Columbia, where she came to earn her Master of Fine Arts from the University of South Carolina. She moved here from Conway, South Carolina where she received her Bachelors of Fine Arts from Coastal Carolina University. Alex is originally from Northern Virginia, where she spent most of her youth visiting museums in D.C. and hiking through the rural woodlands surrounding her home. She is extensively involved in her studio practice and showing her work internationally.

Del'Te Robinson – Benedict Associate Juror

I am a Senior Studio Art Major at Benedict College from Louisville, Kentucky, planning to graduate in May 2017. My area of interest is photography, with a concentration in photo manipulation. My Senior Show is a mixed media installation comprised of life-size sculptures, enhanced by sound and lighting. I work as a freelance DJ for the campus and surrounding community for various events. In addition, I serve as the photographer for the College newspaper and yearbook. I am a member of Phi Mu Alpha Fraternity, Alpha Rho Theta Fraternity and Groove Phi Groove Social Fellowship, and the Benedict College Marching Band of Distinction.

CCAL is proud to support future artists through its Associate Juror program. A portion of the CCAL earnings each year benefits two students from local institutions of higher education. Scholarships are provided to two deserving students for a hands-on paid internship to serve as associate juror's for our annual show. They are each charged with selecting a piece for award and presenting to the league their selection and justification for that selection. They are also granted an honorary membership to CCAL for one year.
