Steve has made a career of painting since 1975. He lives in Ormond Beach, Fla. with his wife, Janet, both of whom are Signature Members of the American Watercolor Society.

Steve travels to Greece, Italy, Spain and France and these experiences have had a profound impact on the color, sense of light and place and overall direction of his painting.
